

Pasado's Safe Haven Personal Animal Policy

For the safety and well-being of you, your pets, and Pasado's Safe Haven's visitors, volunteers, staff, and animals, personal animals are not allowed on the Pasado's Safe Haven's Sanctuary campus. Exceptions to this policy include service animals, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (see conditions below) and animals participating in a pre-arranged "Meet and Greet" before an adoption. Service animals will be allowed in Pasado's House only and all visiting animals must be kept on a leash. No animal may be left unattended in a vehicle at any time.

According to the Americans with Disabilities Act, a service animal is a dog or miniature horse that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability.

Pasado's Safe Haven reserves the right to deny or revoke access of your personal animal(s) to any and all areas of the Sanctuary in the event that animal poses a direct threat to health and safety, is not housebroken, or is out of control and you are unable or unwilling to effectively control it. It is your responsibility to maintain control of your animal(s) at all times while visiting Pasado's Safe Haven. Pasado's Safe Haven assumes no liability for the actions, health, and safety of your animal(s) while visiting the Sanctuary.
