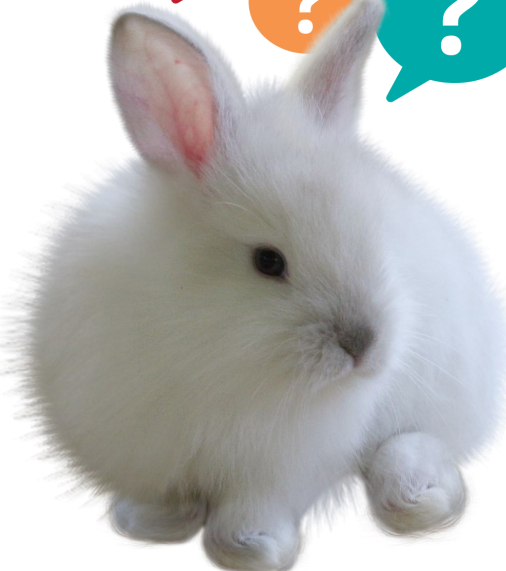


BUNNY DETECTIVES

An activity for young learners to take action against animal testing!



Did you know that sometimes companies that sell things like soap, shampoo and makeup hurt animals?

It's true! Animals like bunnies are used to test soap, cleaning supplies and makeup before they are sold. This is called animal testing. When these tests are done on our animal friends it causes them pain.

We have the power to make a difference for animals even when we go shopping!



STAND UP AGAINST BULLIES!

Bullying can happen to anyone—humans and animals.

We can tell companies that we do not like it when they hurt animals by not buying from them. This is a way that people can ask companies to do the right thing. Just like when we see a bully hurting someone and we tell them to stop.

Instead we can buy from companies who do not test on animals.

Pro Tip: If you want to know if a company doesn't test on animals just look for a bunny on the label.

We can all be Bunny Detectives when we go shopping for cleaning supplies, soap, shampoo and makeup!



LOOK FOR THE BUNNY!

Animal testing hurts animals! When cleaning supplies, soap, shampoo and makeup have a bunny on the label it means that it was not tested on animals.

Bunny Detectives help animals by looking for bunnies on cleaning supplies, soap, shampoo and makeup and choosing those items at the grocery store.

Step 1: Collect cleaning supplies, soap, shampoo and makeup from around your house.

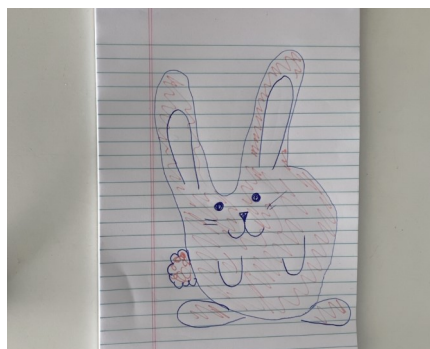
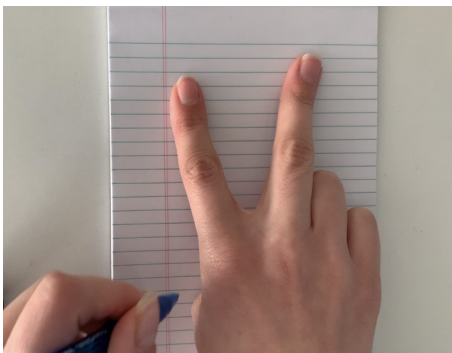
Step 2: Use your sharp eyes to spot any bunnies that might be on the label. A bunny means it wasn't tested on animals. Watch out, they can be very small! **Fact:** Be like a bunny and eat lots of carrots because they are good for your eyes.

Look for bunnies like these:



Step 3: Make a pile of items that have a bunny on them and talk to a grown up about looking for more bunnies the next time you go to a grocery store.

Step 4: Make your own bunny! And tell others what it means.
